POST BIOPSY WOUND CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Please keep the bandage that we place intact until your next shower or bath. At

that time, cleanse the wound gently with soap and water and apply a small amount

of Vaseline to the area once a day until healed. Keeping the wound moist with

Vaseline will prevent a thick scab from forming, which allows the wound to heal

quickly and will also minimize scarring. We prefer Vaseline to antibiotic ointments

because some people are allergic to antibiotic ointments such as Neosporin.

Biopsy sites usually take 2-3 weeks to heal. During this time, you should expect to

see a thin rim of redness around the edge of the biopsy site.

If the biopsy site is on your face and you do not wish to wear a bandage, it is

especially important to keep the biopsy site covered with Vaseline at least 2-3 times

per day.

In other locations, like the back, it will be easier to care for your biopsy site if it is

allowed to dry out and form a scab. This is done by cleansing gently with soap and

water but then leaving it uncovered instead of applying Vaseline and a bandage. This approach will delay healing and may result in a less desirable scar than when

the wound is kept moist, but it will be easier to care for.
